## The Experience

In this pristine wilderness blessed with abundant wildlife, your senses, dulled over years by city traffic and lights, are quickly restored to a heightened state as you are gently guided through lion, buffalo, elephant and leopard country, perhaps to stalk an impala, zebra or even a lion.

The unspoilt Northern Serengeti presents some of the most interesting, varied and rewarding wilderness areas for walking safaris in the whole of East Africa. The highlight of course is the Mara River, where between June and October you have a chance to watch the migration crossings close-up. But there is much more to this area dotted with kopjes, boulders, hidden valleys and hills with stunning vistas of the extensive Mara/Serengeti eco-system.

You may follow spoor and footprints in pursuit of a male leopard or a leopard tortoise. Creatures big or small are explored and discussed in detail on walks, around camp fires, under the stars, and at sunset with a gin and tonic in hand. There is never a dull moment in the wild. Every minute, every hour unravels the joys of the African wilderness in a very profound and intimate way.

Your walking safari adventure will be wrapped in luxury for a few nights at the deluxe and popular Lemala Mara seasonal camp which is located close to the Mara River. Its new spacious sleeper tents and fantastic lounge areas, which include a gorgeous little bar, provide comfort, style and ambience expected of a premier mobile camp. The staff are attentive, food is excellent and guiding is of a high standard.

The Lemala Mara walking safari is a great way for families and friends to enjoy Northern Serengeti's natural wonders.



## How it works

Our walking safaris will take you into the most remote corners of northern Serengeti National Park, giving guests the opportunity to explore this amazing park on foot.

All of our walking safaris are multi-day walks starting with a minimum of our 2-night program (1½ days walking) to 3-nights (2½ days walking) in the bush. Longer programs are available. In addition to the nights in the bush, you will spend 3 or 4 nights at our beautiful Lemala Mara Camp either before or after your walking safari.

In general, the walking program begins each day with an early wakeup and breakfast in camp. We start walking soon after breakfast to miss the heat of the day. We carry lunch with us and enjoy it at a scenic stop during our walk. We plan to return to camp around 15:00 for a relaxing afternoon. A late afternoon walk to a nearby scenic place is made even more perfect with sundowner drinks.

Our walking guests can expect to see various species; the most common been Impalas, Giraffe, Zebra, Wildebeest, Warthogs, Buffalo and Elephants. For safety reasons and in respect to the animals, we do not approach animals unnecessarily close. Obviously we give some of these species a wide berth, but still enjoy viewing them from outside the confines of a vehicle. Besides the mammals, walking provides an ideal way to view a huge variety of woodlands and riverine bird species as well as plants, insects, reptiles and amphibians.



We have a backup vehicle and small camp crew, responsible for moving the camp to new locations and available as emergency backup for walkers. Guests never need to carry more than a small day pack with water and personal equipment they wish to have handy for that day's walk.

We generally move the camp once during a walking safari longer than 2 nights. The camp will stay in one location for walks of only 2 nights and the walks will be day walks into different areas around the camp. All walking guests need to be generally fit and to be able to comfortably walk at least 5km's/day on uneven terrain in order to enjoy the experience. Our walks are not strenuous and rarely more than 15kms per day walking over gentle hills. We can tailor our walks to suit guests comfort level since most of our walks are private for only your group.

An extremely experienced walking guide will be guiding all walks. This guide will carry a high caliber rifle and he can actually use it... Our guides have been trained to not only guide safe walks but to also bring across the essence of a walking safari and to make guests realize just how special they are having the opportunity to explore this remote corner of bush all alone and on foot. An armed TANAPA ranger will also join the walk.

### **Children**

Children as young as 8yrs can join the walking safari but they might find some of the walks strenuous.

### **Indemnity**

All participants will need to sign an indemnity form.



## Fly Camp

The aim of our camp is to access remote areas in the easiest and affordable manner but still give guests a high level of comfort.

Our camp is designed to fit on a small trailer that can easily be towed in to the bush by our crew. Tents are 3-man dome tents that are easy to set-up with plenty of floor space for 2 people. You are not going to do the Macarena in it but it is comfortable for a good night's rest out in the bush. Sleep comes easy on comfy 4-inch mattresses on the ground and the bedding is proper cotton duvets, sheets and pillows. For the more adventurous we have a star tent. This tent is made completely out of gauze, allowing guests to just lie in bed and gaze at the night sky. These tents have a 'splash sheet' that can easily be put up should it rain.

Most meals will be served under the stars, but in the case of a rain shower we have a small mess tent. The meals are outstanding. The majority of preparations will be done in our kitchens in Arusha, this way much more elaborate meals can be served. A small crew will join the walking safari to do all the final preparations of the food and help around the camp. Cold drinks, beers and a small wine selection will be available.

# Lemala Mara Fact Sheet

## Sleeping tents: (NEW)

- Large spacious sleeper tents with wooden floor boards and 24-hr solar lighting
- King size beds or 2 queen size beds - 100% linen bedding
- Ensuite bathrooms with separate safari shower and flush toilet cubicles
- Running water for wash basin
- Wardrobe, armchair, writing desk, outdoor lounge

## Mess tent (NEW) & meals:

- Spacious mess tent with 2 sitting rooms, dining room and a bar
- Excellent meals prepared by a well-trained chef from fresh produce in camp.
- Grounded coffee, tea and water are available in the mess tent at all times.
- House drinks included - water, soda, beer, wine, gin, vodka, whiskey

## Vehicle:

- Open-sided 4x4 vehicle fitted with charging units and fridge
- Wildlife books and binoculars



# Fly Camp Fact sheet

## Guests sleeping tents:

- 2,5m by 2,5m floor space and 2m high.
- 100% insect proof.
- 100% water proof even with the windows open.
- Three windows and roof vents for good ventilation.
- Hard 6-inch foam mattresses.
- 100% linen bedding; duvets, sheets and pillow covers. Good quality duvet inners.
- Additional fleece blanket provided.
- Bed side tables.
- Solar reading lights.
- Solar over-head light.
- Face washing basin and mirror outside of the tent.
- Two chairs outside of the tent.
- Ground sheet in front of the tent to make a comfortable veranda.
- The camp crew will make up the tent every day.

## Mess tent & meals:

- All meals are sit down meals served by a waiter.
- Meals are 4 course meals prepared by a well-trained chef from fresh produce in camp.
- Cutlery is all good quality.
- Grounded coffee, tea and water are available in the mess tent at all times.
- Mess tent is 4m by 3m large and 2,5m high with good solar lighting.
- 100% water proof with clear PVC sides that can roll down.
- All the sides are covered with mesh and all the sides can zip open and roll up to create a comfortable open dining feeling.
- Drinks are provided free of charge in camp. This is a variety of sodas, variety of beers, gin and tonic, juices and water.

## Toilet tent:

- Toilet tent is not en-suite to the sleeping tent.
- The tent has a large shower compartment and large toilet compartment.
- Showers are shower-buckets that are hoisted in to the air on a pulley system. The water is hot and the shower-bucket is easy and comfortable to use and create a nice shower experience.

- Toilets are large wooden toilet boxes and we use a shallow pit latrine system.

## Camp movement:

- The camp moves with the migration.
- The camp move with a supply vehicle and trailer.
- The camp crew is responsible for the set up of camp.
- Camp is generally set up a day prior to the guest's arrival.
- The camp is ready when guests arrive in camp.
- Guests do not need to be involved in any set up of the camp.

## Camp crew:

- Every camp will have a chef, waiter and driver. So a minimum of three crew per camp.
